Finance Summary

For the Period Ended May 31, 2026

Executive Summary

This report summarizes the financial position and operating results of the Tehachapi Valley Healthcare District (TVHD) for the month ended May 31, 2026, and for fiscal year-to-date (July 1, 2025 through May 31, 2026). The District remains well-capitalized with strong liquidity. For the month of May, the District recorded positive net income, primarily driven by the receipt of Kern County property tax revenue and other non-operating revenue, which together more than offset the monthly operating loss and non-cash depreciation. On a fiscal year-to-date basis, operations continue to reflect a net loss, driven largely by non-cash depreciation on the hospital and related facilities.

Of the \$231,370.22, amount of \$156,370.22 was received from Adventist Health due to a duplicate payment made by former management. Including this amount, total income recognized for the month was \$523,283.39. The District's reported net income for May of \$305,166.49 reflects all revenue less total operating expenses and non-cash depreciation.

Background

The Tehachapi Valley Recreation and Park District has submitted a grant application requesting funds from the Healthcare District for the rehabilitation and repair of the Dye Natatorium Community Pool. The project consists of leak repair work, heater repair work, and a temperature control board to restore the community pool to a safe, functional, and publicly accessible condition.

The request is brought forward under the District's Grants and Sponsorships Policy adopted February 20, 2024, which authorizes the Board to allocate funds to support community health, with priority given to proposals that demonstrate collaboration and benefit to underserved populations within the District's boundaries. More than half of the pool's users are residents of the District, and the facility is located within the District's geographic boundaries.

Public Health Purpose

Restoration of the community pool advances the public health mission of the District in several respects:

- Aquatic exercise and swimming are medically recognized, low-impact cardiovascular activities that help reduce the risk of chronic disease, including heart disease, obesity, diabetes, and hypertension.
- The pool provides a health-promoting recreational facility for residents of all ages, including seniors and individuals with mobility limitations for whom aquatic exercise is a preferred form of physical activity.
- The facility serves as a venue for swimming instruction, water safety programs, and drowning prevention education.
- Reopening the pool restores access to physical activity for underserved and lower-income residents, furthering the District's health-equity goals.

Current Status

To date, \$17,781 has been spent toward repairing and reopening the pool. The pool remains closed and is not yet open to the public. The Recreation and Park District is awaiting an additional repair estimate, anticipated Monday or Tuesday of next week, which is expected to increase the total amount of the grant.

Because the final repair cost is still pending, the grant amount has not yet been finalized. The dollar figures in the accompanying resolution will be completed once the forthcoming estimate is received.

Fiscal Impact

Grant amount to be determined pending receipt of the forthcoming repair estimate; \$17,781 has been expended toward the project to date. If approved, funds would be disbursed from the Valley Strong general checking account, consistent with the District's adopted budget for fiscal year 2025–2026.

Recommendation

That the Board of Directors adopt Resolution No. _____ authorizing a grant to the Tehachapi Valley Recreation and Park District for rehabilitation of the Dye Natatorium Community Pool, with the grant amount to be inserted upon receipt of the pending estimate.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE TEHACHAPI VALLEY HEALTHCARE DISTRICT AUTHORIZING A GRANT TO THE TEHACHAPI VALLEY RECREATION AND PARK DISTRICT FOR COMMUNITY POOL REHABILITATION; MAKING FINDINGS OF PUBLIC PURPOSE PURSUANT TO HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE SECTION 32000, ET SEQ.; AND APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF A GRANT AGREEMENT

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Tehachapi Valley Healthcare District (the “District”) is a healthcare district duly organized and existing under the California Health and Safety Code section 32000, et seq., with authority to promote the health and welfare of residents within its geographic boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the District is statutorily authorized to do any and all things necessary and proper to carry out the purposes for which it was organized, including the promotion of public health and the prevention of disease; and

WHEREAS, the District has adopted a Grants and Sponsorships Policy (the “Grants Policy”), which authorizes the Board to budget and allocate funds each fiscal year to support community healthcare, health education, and health promotion; and

WHEREAS, the Grants Policy provides that grant and sponsorship applications shall be funded only if they are consistent with the District’s mission, and that priority consideration shall be given to proposals that demonstrate collaboration and benefit to underserved populations within the District’s geographic boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the Tehachapi Valley Recreation And Park District (the “Grantee”), a public agency organized and existing under California law, has submitted a grant application requesting funds in the amount of \$[AMOUNT] for the rehabilitation and repair of the Dye Natatorium Community Pool located at 400 S. Snyder Ave, Tehachapi, California (the “Project”); and

WHEREAS, the Project consists of leak repair work, heater repair work and temperature control board to repair and restore the community pool to safe, functional, and publicly accessible condition; and

WHEREAS, the Board has reviewed the information submitted by the Grantee and finds that the Project directly supports and advances the public health purposes of the District in the following respects:

1. Aquatic exercise and swimming are medically recognized as low-impact cardiovascular activities that reduce the risk of chronic disease, including heart disease, obesity, diabetes, and hypertension, which are prevalent health concerns in the Tehachapi Valley community;

2. Access to a community pool provides a health-promoting recreational facility for District residents of all ages, including seniors and individuals with mobility limitations for whom aquatic exercise is a primary or preferred form of physical activity;
3. The community pool serves as a venue for swimming instruction, water safety programs, and drowning prevention education, all of which protect the health and safety of children and other District residents; and
4. The loss of the community pool has reduced access to health-promoting physical activity for underserved and lower-income residents who lack access to private fitness facilities, and restoration of the pool furthers the District's mission to address health equity within its boundaries; and

WHEREAS, more than half of the pool's users are residents within the District, and the Project's main facility is located within the geographic boundaries of the District, consistent with the criteria set forth in the Grants Policy; and

WHEREAS, the grant award does not exceed 150% of any prior-year grant to the Grantee, and the request is consistent with the funding limitations set forth in the Grants Policy; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that the Project constitutes a public purpose within the meaning of the California Constitution and applicable law, that the expenditure of District funds for the Project serves a direct public benefit to District residents, and that any private benefit to the Grantee is incidental to the overriding public health purpose served by the Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Tehachapi Valley Healthcare District as follows:

Section 1. Recitals Incorporated. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference as findings of the Board.

Section 2. Public Purpose Findings. The Board hereby finds and determines that the rehabilitation and repair of the Dye Natatorium Community Pool constitutes a public purpose consistent with the District's statutory authority under Health and Safety Code section 32000, et seq., and that the expenditure of District funds for the Project will confer a direct public benefit on the residents of the District by promoting physical health, disease prevention, health equity, and public safety.

SUBJECT: Resolution Authorizing a \$3,000 Grant to Stallion Springs CSD for AEDs

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Board **adopt the attached Resolution** authorizing a grant in an amount not to exceed \$3,000 to the Stallion Springs Community Services District (CSD) for the procurement and deployment of two automated external defibrillators (AEDs), together with associated equipment, training, and supplies.

Background

Stallion Springs CSD has applied for grant funding to install two AEDs at publicly accessible locations within the District, including the Stallion Springs CSD Recreation Center and pool area. The request includes CPR/AED training for designated personnel and public AED awareness components.

Sudden cardiac arrest is a leading cause of death nationally, with survival declining roughly 10% for every minute without defibrillation. Early AED use within the first three to five minutes can raise survival from below 10% to as high as 70%. Placing AEDs in high-traffic public venues directly advances the District's mission of disease prevention and protection of public health and safety.

Fiscal Impact

Amount not to exceed **\$3,000.00**, to be encumbered and disbursed from the Valley Strong general checking account, consistent with the adopted FY 2025–2026 budget. The grant is contingent on execution of a Grant Agreement.

Policy Compliance

The request is consistent with the District's Grants and Sponsorships Policy adopted February 20, 2024. Because the amount is under \$25,000 and is for health and safety equipment, it qualifies as a "simplified grant" under Section 12 of the Policy and is eligible for expedited processing. The Board's adoption includes findings that the expenditure serves a direct public purpose under Health and Safety Code § 32000 et seq., with any private benefit to the grantee being incidental.

Recommended Motion

"I move to adopt the Resolution authorizing a grant not to exceed \$3,000 to Stallion Springs Community Services District for the procurement and deployment of automated external defibrillators, and to authorize the CEO to execute the Grant Agreement."

RESOLUTION NO. _____

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE TEHACHAPI VALLEY HEALTHCARE DISTRICT AUTHORIZING A GRANT TO STALLION SPRINGS COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT FOR THE PROCUREMENT AND DEPLOYMENT OF AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATORS; MAKING FINDINGS OF PUBLIC PURPOSE PURSUANT TO HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE SECTION 32000, ET SEQ.; AND AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF A GRANT AGREEMENT

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Tehachapi Valley Healthcare District (the “District”) is a healthcare district duly organized and existing under the California Health and Safety Code Section 32000, et seq., with authority to promote the health and welfare of residents within its geographic boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the District is authorized to do any and all things necessary and proper to carry out the purposes for which it was organized, including the promotion of public health and the prevention of disease and premature death; and

WHEREAS, the District has adopted a Grants and Sponsorships Policy (the “Grants Policy”), which authorizes the Board to budget and allocate funds each fiscal year to support community healthcare, health education, and health promotion; and

WHEREAS, the Grants Policy provides that grant and sponsorship applications shall be funded only if they are consistent with the District’s mission, and that priority consideration shall be given to proposals that demonstrate direct benefit to residents within the District’s geographic boundaries; and

WHEREAS, Stallion Springs Community Services District (the “Grantee”), a public agency organized and existing under California law, has submitted a grant application requesting funds in the amount of \$3,000 for the procurement and deployment of two automated external defibrillators (“AEDs”) and associated equipment, training, and supplies (the “Project”); and

WHEREAS, sudden cardiac arrest is a leading cause of death in the United States, accounting for more than 350,000 out-of-hospital cardiac arrests annually, with survival rates declining by approximately 10% for each minute that passes without defibrillation; and

WHEREAS, early defibrillation through the use of an AED, when deployed within the first three to five minutes of cardiac arrest, can increase survival rates from below 10% to as high as 70%, making the public availability of AEDs one of the most effective life-saving interventions in community health; and

WHEREAS, California Health and Safety Code Section 1797.196 reflects the Legislature’s recognition that AED deployment in public settings is a critical component of community emergency preparedness and public health infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the Board has reviewed the grant application submitted by the Grantee and finds that the Project directly supports and advances the public health purposes of the District in the following respects:

1. The deployment of AEDs at publicly accessible locations within the District will directly reduce the risk of death from sudden cardiac arrest among District residents, employees, and visitors by enabling rapid defibrillation before emergency medical services can arrive;
2. The Project advances the District's core mission of disease prevention and promotion of public health by establishing a network of life-saving devices accessible to the general public at no cost to individual users;
3. AED deployment in public venues frequented by District residents, including the Stallion Springs CSD Recreation Center and the pool area, which targets the populations most likely to benefit, including residents with cardiovascular risk factors who may not have immediate access to emergency medical care;
4. The Project includes [CPR and AED training for designated personnel / public AED awareness components], which further expands community capacity to respond to cardiac emergencies and promotes health education among District residents; and

WHEREAS, the Project's primary deployment locations are within or directly serve the geographic boundaries of the District, and the residents of the District will be the primary beneficiaries of the AEDs procured under this grant; and

WHEREAS, the grant award is consistent with the funding limitations set forth in the Grants Policy and the Grantee has not previously received a grant from the District—select applicable alternative; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that the Project constitutes a public purpose within the meaning of the California Constitution and applicable law, that the expenditure of District funds for the Project serves a direct public benefit to District residents, and that any private benefit to the Grantee is incidental to the overriding public health and life-safety purpose served by the Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Tehachapi Valley Healthcare District as follows:

Section 1. Recitals Incorporated. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference as findings of the Board.

Section 2. Public Purpose Findings. The Board hereby finds and determines that the procurement and deployment of automated external defibrillators at publicly accessible locations within and serving the District constitutes a public purpose consistent with the District's statutory authority under Health and Safety Code Section 32000 et seq., and that the expenditure of District funds for the Project will confer a direct public benefit on the residents of the District by reducing the risk of death from sudden cardiac arrest, advancing community emergency preparedness, and promoting public health and safety.

Section 3. Grant Authorization. The Board hereby approves a grant to Stallion Springs Community Services District in an amount not to exceed \$3,000.00 for the Project, subject to execution of the Grant Agreement and compliance with all conditions set forth therein.

Section 4. Approval of Grant Agreement. The CEO is hereby authorized and directed to execute the Grant Agreement on behalf of the District, and to take any and all further actions necessary and appropriate to implement this Resolution and the Grant Agreement.

Section 5. Grants Policy Compliance. The Board hereby finds that the grant authorized herein is consistent with the District’s Grants and Sponsorships Policy adopted February 20, 2024, and satisfies all applicable requirements thereof, including the requirements that the application be consistent with the District’s mission, that a written application and overview have been submitted, and that the grant award be within the funding limitations established by the Policy.

Section 6. Simplified Grant Procedure. The Board further finds that this grant qualifies as a “simplified grant” under Section 12 of the Grants Policy, as the amount requested is less than \$25,000 and is for the procurement of health and safety equipment, and directs that review and processing of this grant be expedited to the extent possible.

Section 7. Budget. The Chief Executive Officer is hereby directed to encumber and disburse funds in an amount not to exceed \$3,000.00 from Valley Strong general checking account for the purposes authorized by this Resolution, consistent with the District’s adopted budget for fiscal year 2025-2026.

Section 8. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
